Completed Fellowships:

ARIZONA

Nohwike' Bagowa White Mountain Apache Museum; Fort Apache, AZ

Spring 2009: Fellow Marcilla Cruz assisted museum staff in the selection of loan objects and preliminary negotiation of loan agreements from major museums for installation in the museum's long term exhibition *Ndee Biké/Footprints of the Apache*. She also assisted in educational material and visitor services development.

The Navajo Nation Museum; Window Rock, Arizona

Summer/Fall 2008: The Fellow initiated and established a comprehensive resource of Navajo Tribal Leaders from historical times to present. The Fellow conducted research and compiled a publication to distribute to schools, and nationwide, via print and the Navajo Nation Museum website.
